Winooski – Thanks to the generosity of stylist Rosa Prany of La Solita Salon in South Burlington who donated her services, participants in Vermont Works for Women’s Transitional Jobs Program received new hairstyles to go along with their new outlook on finding employment. Each participant was delighted with her new look and -- equipped with skills training, support, and a new sense of confidence she has received through the program -- is eager to step back into the workforce.

The Transitional Jobs Program is an employment training program designed for women who are transitioning off of state assistance and looking to join or rejoin the workforce and/or women who are returning to the community after incarceration. It offers skills training and employment support to participants as they are placed in short-term, part-time positions with local employers. The essential underpinning of the program, which is based on a national model, is that -- with support, structure, hard work and determination -- every participant can be successful in the workplace.

Transitional Jobs is a program of Vermont Works for Women whose mission is to help women and girls recognize their potential and explore, pursue and excel in work that leads to economic independence.
