• FSS is a voluntary, goal-based employment incentive program available to some participants of Burlington Housing Authority's Section 8 program

Family Self Sufficiency Program

- FSS is intended for people who want to increase their household income and build savings
- FSS provides one-on-one support to increase earned income and reduce utilization of assistance programs by supporting employment goals and connecting participants to community supports
- FSS is a multi-year program designed to help individuals make sustainable life changes that improve financial wellness
- The heart of FSS is the unique opportunity to accumulate escrow savings. The escrow (savings) account is opened following enrollment into the program once a participant has reported an earned income increase that results in an increase in their portion of rent
